

The Remote Sensing and Photogrammetry (RS&P) Commission of the Spatial Sciences Institute are offering a scholarship to the value of \$2,200 in 2008 for a female Honours level student undertaking a research project focussed on remote sensing or photogrammetry methods and/or applications. The scholarship is aimed at promoting the research of young women in the RS&P field.

The scholarship is to be used explicitly for funding attendance at the 14 Australasian Remote Sensing & Photogrammetry Conference (ARSPC) in Darwin, Northern Territory, 29 September- 3 October 2008. The funds may be used for travel, accommodation, conference registration, and (funding permitting) workshop attendance.

Eligibility

To be eligible for the scholarship you must meet the following requirements:

- You must be a female Young Professional (<36 y.o.);
- You must be enrolled at an Australian or New Zealand university during the 2008 year;
- You must be undertaking a research project at Honours level in remote sensing or photogrammetry methods and/or applications; and
- You must submit a paper for presentation at the 14 ARSPC on your research if successful.

Application

Your application must include the following:

- Name
- University
- Supervisor(s)
- Are you an SSI member
- Research project title
- Brief summary of your honours project (250 words maximum)
- How you will benefit from attending and presenting at the 14 ARSPC (100 words maximum)
- Abstract of the paper you will submit for the 14 ARSPC if successful.
